CLASS DESCRIPTION

This 4-hour class is designed to assist parents in supporting children who have witnessed, or have been affected by domestic violence.

UPON COMPLETION OF THE SEMINAR YOU WILL BE GIVEN A CERTIFICATE OF ATTENDANCE.

The classes are 4 hours in length and are offered once a month on a Saturday from 9:00am-1:00pm.

Classes are provided by certified parenting instructors.

TOPICS INCLUDE

- What is Domestic Violence?
- To what extent are children impacted by domestic violence?
- What can parents do to help children?
- What actions should parents avoid?
- What are strategies for parenting after the violence?
- How do Moms and Dads interact after domestic violence?
- What is the long-term impact of parental conflict on children?
